After almost two years of a hard border, COVID-19 has arrived in our state and made its presence felt. Virtually every family and every workplace has had to adapt to the rising number of cases. It's brought changes to our lives that we had yet to grasp at the start of the year.

At the same time, our economic situation has deteriorated. Inflation is now at record levels, meaning that for many WA families, every day goods are becoming out of reach. Rising interest rates are causing further pain, and finding an affordable rental property has never been more difficult.

Throughout this incredibly difficult period, Vinnies has walked alongside vulnerable West Australians, and provided the support they need. Whether it is through our Emergency Assistance and Support Program, financial counselling or our homelessness, housing and mental health services - when times are hard, we're here.

This is only possible through the generous support of our donors. In this edition of Impact, we invite you to take a look at some of the things we've achieved together.

Acknowledgement of Country

You may recall our Autumn Appeal, which featured the story of a father's struggle with addiction, ill-health, homelessness and how, with the help of Vinnies and supporters like you, he regained care of his daughter.

Steve found himself in a perfect storm.

"Things went haywire, it came to the point where I had to abandon the house, we went to the streets."

As he could not provide a safe and stable home for Sarah, she was removed from his care. Steve was devastated.

He knew something had to change, and that's when Vinnies became an integral part of his story.

Steve was given the opportunity to transform his circumstances and get his daughter back. By having a safe place to call home and wrap-around services, Steve could focus on his health, well-being and provide the stable home needed for his daughter to thrive.

With support from Vinnies, Steve's perseverance paid off when he was reunited with Sarah.

We recently checked in with Steve, and he's doing very well.

He is now living permanently in a Department of Communities property and enjoying life. He no longer needs the assistance of support workers. Most importantly, Sarah is thriving at school.

Steve's story shows that the generosity of our donors can lead to lasting change.

AARON'S STORY

Thanks to the generosity of supporters like you, Vinnies is able to help people through a number of specialist services. One of these is an accommodation service for adults with a persistent and enduring mental health diagnosis who may otherwise be homeless or at risk of homelessness.

Known as The Village and consisting of 28 units, it provides residents with 24-hour person-centred care that promotes their recovery and maximises their independence.

One resident on this journey to independence is 26-year-old Aaron.

Aaron came to The Village six months ago after a long stay in hospital. Prior to this, Aaron was living at home with his parents and brother, but it wasn't the best arrangement for him or his family.

Aaron has complex mental health challenges, and was struggling to remain in the family home. During his stay in hospital, he agreed to a referral to Vinnies Mental Health Services, so he would have access to support and recovery

resources to build a life of his own and work towards independence.

When Aaron moved into The Village he was very quiet and withdrawn, barely speaking to anyone and spending most of his days pacing around the grounds. In time, Aaron began working with his Recovery Support Worker and has since obtained a NDIS funding package.

He has also started volunteering in one of our Vinnies shops for a few hours per week.

The Village's peer support program has allowed Aaron to get involved in new and exciting activities, including roller skating, rock climbing and learning how to cook. Aaron says he does not like rock climbing, but he's glad he gave it a go.





Aaron is very new to his recovery journey, but he has come so far already in such a short time. His long-term goals are to go back to school, to start working and to rebuild healthy relationships with his family.

Your support is helping Aaron on his journey.

YOUNG PEOPLE GET CREATIVE TO MARK HOMELESSNESS WEEK

We want to share something special that happened during Homelessness Week in early August.

Throughout the week, our Passages Youth Engagement Hub in Perth facilitated a live artwork piece, which was created by the young people who use the service.

They decided to use a brick wall as the basic concept, which can represent everything from the foundations that make up a young person's journey to the bricks that were used to build Passages.

The young people then got creative and added into each brick either a service, a place, or an experience that has been a part of their journey and experience of homelessness.

The result is a beautiful expression of what Homelessness Week is all about, and a reminder that we need to do whatever we can to end homelessness.

Our upcoming Spring Appeal will help raise funds for the young people at our Passages Youth Engagement Hubs.

We share with you the story of Willow, who at a young age escaped an unsafe home with her younger sister, only to find herself homeless.

She received the support she needed from the youth workers at Passages, who helped her turn her life around.

Passages Youth Engagement Hubs

Vinnies is committed to supporting the most vulnerable members of the community through our specialised homelessness services.

Passages Youth Engagement Hubs were established more than 20 years ago due to growing rates of youth homelessness and the need for a unique specialist engagement service.

Passages Youth Engagement Hubs are a joint venture between Vinnies WA and the Rotary Club of Perth and Mandurah. The two Hub locations offer a safe, friendly and non-judgemental space to access support and referrals for marginalised and at-risk young people aged 12 to 25.









We farewell Gladys Demissie, who led the St Vincent de Paul Society of WA as State President for four years, and helped steer it through the COVID pandemic. She brought members, staff and volunteers closer together, and found new ways to help people in need.

Looking back over her term, Ms Demissie credits the idea of 'One Society' as the driving force behind her approach.

"It doesn't matter whether someone gets paid for what they do or whether they volunteer their time, the fact is, we're all here because we have signed up to what the Society is about," she said.

Despite the COVID pandemic having a significant impact on her term as State President, she resolved to overcome any challenges that came her way.

"I'm just so proud of the way that we were agile and flexible. We were all trying to adapt, but not lose sight of why we're here."

Ms Demissie highlights one new initiative she started perhaps as her most significant achievement.

"I'm proud of the work we did through the State President's Housing Fund, which has particularly supported women escaping family and domestic violence.



"We've been able to help people to stay in their homes or motels. We helped one woman with seven children stay in a motel, until she finally got a rental. That is a memory that will stick with me," she said.

The State President's Housing fund is now a significant part of the help Vinnies provides, and it's only possible thanks to the generous donations from people like you.

VOLUNTEERING IS A CALLING

Liana volunteers at the Vinnies Call Centre. During each shift, she takes dozens of requests for help, ranging from financial assistance to food or help with housing.

"There are so many marginalised, disadvantaged, vulnerable people in need within my community that are either in crisis, hardship or struggling in some way," she explains.

As a retired nurse, she has a lifelong passion to work with others on a personal level, assisting struggling West Australians get the support they need.

It's help that is only possible through your donations.

Liana first volunteered at the Vinnies Call Centre in 2017, and re-joined the team earlier this year.

For her, volunteering with Vinnies is about giving something back to her community.

"I have always been inspired by the great work that Vinnies does to provide emergency relief assistance and other support to those in need. "It is an honour and privilege to be part of a great organisation at Vinnies, and fantastic team within the Call Centre, all working together to make a positive impact on the WA community," she says.

She grew up under the constant threat of violence from her abusive father. By the age of 15, she was living in a youth shelter. A year later, she was pregnant with Charlotte and in a violent relationship.

For two frightening years, Leah and Charlotte lived in their car and spent their days in parks because they had nowhere else to go.


