

THE VORTCS PROGRAM

St Vincent de Paul Society Queensland delivers the VoRTCS program in Brisbane. Small volunteer teams visit refugee families each week to offer support, including:

- Helping the family learn English, including ESL study
- Talking about the Brisbane area and life in Australia
- · Writing resumes to look for jobs
- Referring the family to other helpful support organisations
- Using computers and mobile phones
- Telling the family about local events and fun things to do
- Teaching how to make medical appointments

VoRTCS is a good way for refugee families to meet people in their area, learn from the volunteers, and make good friendships.

VoRTCS volunteers also go to community events throughout the year such as the MOSAIC Multicultural Festival and the LUMINOUS Lantern Parade!

OUR VORTCS FAMILIES

Our refugee families come from many different countries such as Afghanistan, Sudan, Myanmar, Iraq, Thailand, Syria, Burundi, Somalia, Sierra Leone, Democratic Republic of Congo, Iran, Bhutan, Eritrea, and many more!

Refugee families usually hear about VoRTCS from other organisations. If the refugee family is interested, the organisation will refer them to VoRTCS.

Refugee families usually don't need help from VoRTCS any longer than 1 or 2 years because they become comfortable living in Brisbane. This is a big achievement for the family and their tutors, and the family can then 'graduate' from VoRTCS.

OUR VORTCS TUTORS
