
If you find that The VInsider isn't the right fit for you or if you'd like to include additional team members in our conversations, feel free to sign up or unsubscribe at any time.

Support Vinnies in Term One

Want to start the year with a hands-on donation activity that supports people transitioning out of homelessness? Consider creating a "Welcome to Home" pack as a class!

These packs will be given to young people and adults in WA who are transitioning into their first home after experiencing homelessness- often with little to nothing to call "theirs".

Each pack can be unique, but will ideally include (new):

- Cutlery kit for one
- One plate, bowl, and mug
- A tea towel
- Bath towels
- A face washer
- A hand towel
- A bath mat
- Broom and dustpan
- Some small, homely items to make their new space feel like home (such as a plastic plant, picture frame, or reed diffusers)

Alternatively, as we enter a new year,
Conferences are asking for donations of food
to refresh their pantry, blankets to prepare for
the winter, and funds to offer support to
families.

2024 Planning

Get ready for a full and exciting year of making a positive impact with St. Vincent de Paul Society of WA!

Get ready for a full and exciting year of making a positive impact with St. Vincent de Paul Society of WA! As we look ahead to the school terms, we've crafted a plan for your engagement, ensuring each term is brimming with opportunities to contribute to our shared mission. Each school is unique, so always feel free to adjust and add as needed!

Term 1

 Establish a Young Vinnies group within your school to give students the chance to engage with Vinnies throughout the year. Don't forget to order your Vinnies badges!

- Schedule a Vinnies speaker for 2024 to enhance students' understanding and connection with Vinnies.
- Consider participating in the Autumn Appeal to replenish much needed supplies for your local Conference.
- Create a "Welcome to Home" pack for those transitioning out of homelessness

Term 2

- Participate in the 2024 Winter Appeal, collecting non-perishable food, blankets, or funds to support vulnerable community members through the cold winter months.
- Consider volunteering or scheduling a volunteering session for students at their local Vinnies Warehouse in Canning Vale or Bunbury.
- Continue your work with Young Vinnies, meeting regularly and offering ongoing learning and engagement opportunities.

Term 3

- Build empathy by participating in the <u>School Sleepout program</u>. This event provides a unique opportunity for students to better understand the challenges faced by those experiencing homelessness.
- Maintain the momentum of your Young Vinnies group initiatives- consider running an educational poster campaign for the wider school or another student led initiative.

Term 4

- Wrap up the year on a heart-warming note by engaging in the Christmas Appeal to support your local Conference.
- Encourage students to write Christmas cards, spreading joy to those who may need it most.
- Ask students to volunteer their time after school to sort food donated for Christmas

hampers, ensuring it is all in date and bringing the spirit of giving to life.

Meet Ursula Frayne College!

Ursula Frayne has been running a Vinnies student group since 2021. The student group meets fortnightly to organise the school's Vinnies initiatives, such as collecting food and essential items for the Winter Appeal, running a pop-up Vinnies Op-Shop on Frayne Day, being involved in the Vinnies WA Tough Night Out, and creating hampers for the Christmas Appeal. They are connected with their local Conference, the East Victoria Park Conference, and support by donating

the food, essential items and hampers from their appeals as well as the funds raised by the pop-up op shop. They were especially proud of raising over \$35,000 for homeless youth during the Tough Night Out in 2023, and in 2024 they are looking forward to seeing their new Young Vinnies Conference student leaders building upon current and developing new initiatives in support of Vinnies.
