5. Research other well-known refugees in Australia or other countries and complete the lotus diagram on the following page. Some of the questions to consider in your research.


Research focus questions:

### **Teacher Guide - Famous Refugees in Australia**

### **ACTIVITY 1 – COMPREHENSION AND ANALYSIS**

- 1. What were some of the hardships faced by Anh Do on his journey to Australia? Anh Do and his family fled to Australia on a small fishing boat packed with 40 other refugees. During the journey, their boat was twice attacked by pirates. When they were finally rescued, his family had to spend several months in a crowded Malaysian refugee camp.
- 2. What were some of the challenges for Aliir Aliir living in the Kakuma Refugee Camp? Kakuma Refugee Camp is a challenging place to live. There are regular dust storms and the average daily temperature is 40 degrees Celsius. In addition to the weather, there are also snakes and scorpions to worry about, as well as disease in the form of cholera and malaria.
- 3. What social, economic or political contributions have these two men made to Australian society?

Anh Do and Aliir Aliir have both made significant contributions to Australian society. Anh Do has won multiple comedy awards and has also been involved in acting, producing, writing and motivational speaking. His book, The Happiest Refugee, also won 2011 Australian Book of the Year. Aliir Aliir has contributed in the sporting field, currently playing for the Sydney Swans in the AFL.

4. Aliir Aliir and Anh Do are both people who were lucky enough to be granted asylum in Australia. Imagine the experience of people in similar situations who haven't been accepted – how might that feel? What else can they do? What would their lives be like?
