BACKGROUND

The St Vincent de Paul Society Canberra/Goulburn (Vinnies) has served the community for nearly 200 years across the ACT and surrounding southern and western regional areas of NSW with a network of shops and volunteer conferences.

OUR PEOPLE

Offering a hand up to the most vulnerable and marginalised in our society is at the heart of our good works. We are companion-centred. Members, Volunteers and Employees are the backbone of our organisation and work closely together to deliver person-centred care in the most efficient way possible. The passion and dedication of our members, volunteers and employees is evident in the many programs and services we operate, whether this be at local schools, parishes, centres, or outreach services like Vinnies Street to Home or Night Patrol.

FUNDED COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Funding for this group of programs is provided by the ACT Government through multi year contracts (with the exception of the Community Inclusion Program, which is funded by the Australian Government Department of Social Services). This funding is usually secured through a competitive tender process.

SAMARITAN HOUSE

Samaritan House is a 13 bed, crisis accommodation facility and program for men aged between 18 and 65 years.

The program was established in 1995 and is located in the north of Canberra. It operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Residents are provided with individual rooms with shared showers, toilets, laundry and kitchen facilities, food, computer with internet and telephone, personal hygiene items and social support.

All referrals for accommodation come from Onelink, the centralised intake point for all homelessness services in the ACT.

STREET TO HOME

Our Street to Home program, which commenced operation in 2020, supports people who are sleeping rough and/or experiencing chronic long-term homelessness in the ACT.

Street to Home offers both case management and assertive outreach to assist people who are experiencing chronic homelessness, with a focus on physical health, mental health, housing, and legal issues. The program has six residential units offering supported transitional accommodation for rough sleepers.

Street to Home works under the Service Guarantee from Specialist Homelessness Services and upholds the ACT Mental Health Charter of Rights. Program staff actively seek those sleeping rough and engage with them to build relationships underpinned by understanding and respect.

All referrals for accommodation come from Onelink, the centralised intake point for all homelessness services in the ACT.

VINNIES ROADHOUSE

The Roadhouse provides a food engagement program from the Griffin Centre, Civic, including access to a hot evening meal, material aid, support and referral. It provides a safe and welcoming environment for people experiencing, or at risk of homelessness, and people experiencing social isolation.

The program is open from 4pm – 5.30pm, 7 days a week.

The program is supported by our Street to Home program, OZ Harvest, Hare Krishna Canberra and the Soup Kitchen. We work closely with a range of referral partner organisations such as Orange Sky, The Big Issue, GIVIT, and Rainbow Paws.

JUSTICE HOUSING PROGAM

The Justice Housing Program provides accommodation options for individuals who otherwise would remain in detention due to a lack of suitable community-based accommodation. The program also provides accommodation support services to women and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people involved with the criminal justice system, with a focus on trauma-informed, gender-informed and culturally safe practices.

Funded by the ACT Government, the program is a core element of its Building Communities Not Prisons initiative, which seeks to address the lack of available and affordable housing for people released from custody.

The Society provides occupancy support services (case management) for each individual eligible for assistance through the program. This includes assistance with connecting individuals with safe, affordable and suitable housing options, supporting them to engage in auxiliary services such as healthcare, mental health and counselling, addressing financial stress and ensuring they are connected appropriately with government support.

The program's first two houses became operational in May 2020 for men subject to bail. Since then the program has expanded to include ten operational houses comprising two houses for women and eight houses for men. Case Managers are responsible for day-to-day operations and provide support and services as needed during business hours from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday. They engage, assess and support people with holistic, sustainable case management plans. The aim being to assist individuals to develop personal resources that increase their quality of life, connection to community, peer support, wellbeing and address the core issues that brought them to the program.

BLUE DOOR

Blue Door is a drop-in centre offering free nutritious meals, hygiene supplies, clothing, and furniture vouchers, as well as life skills, information, advice, advocacy, and referrals.

Blue Door is open to anyone in need and has over 1,500 drop-ins each month. Meals are available from 11.00am until 1.30pm weekdays, except for public holidays and can be eaten in a community dining room or taken away.

Since 1983, Blue Door has been an integral part of Ainslie Village, a small community housing site in the ACT providing accommodation to approximately 200 people who are living on a low income.

Three quarters of Blue Door participants are Ainslie Village residents.

Blue Door provides a non-threatening, safe and secure environment for all users to access the services, relax and socialise.



FAMILY AND YOUNG PARENTS HOMELESSNESS **SERVICES**

Family and Young Parents Homelessness Services provide specialist housing services to families and young parents (below the ages of 25) in the ACT who are currently at risk of, or experiencing, homelessness. The aim of the service is to support participating families to access and maintain safe, secure, independent, and affordable housing.

Services are provided through case management and address individual factors contributing to the risk of homelessness, with a strong focus on the needs of the children and the family unit. Holistic, person-centred case plans utilise trauma informed approach, and support independent decision making through provision of relevant information and referrals, advocacy, positive role modelling and strengthening life skills. Eligible families are offered temporary transitional accommodation.

Referrals for support normally come from Onelink.

COMPEER

The Compeer program, established in the ACT in 2009, supports people living with diagnosed mental illness. The aim of the program is to reduce social isolation and combat stigma attached to mental illness. The program strives to empower individuals to achieve equality, self-worth, dignity, and trust through the power of friendship.

Compeer matches adult volunteers with individuals in one-onone friendships, based on common interests and hobbies. Once matched, the pair meet up on a regular basis for planned social activities. This allows an authentic friendship to be developed. Compeer works closely with local mental health services and other health professionals.

HOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAM

The Society has been delivering this program since 2015 on behalf of the ACT Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate.

The program helps low-income households to reduce their energy bills (electricity and gas), by educating householders about energy usage and through modifying homes to become more energy efficient.

Home visitations are undertaken by an Energy Efficiency Officer who performs a household energy assessment and provides tailored advice and modifications to help reduce energy usage.

As part of the program, assistance may include an energy saving kit, a cooling towel and heated throw rug, draught proofing of doors and windows, and in some cases, replacement of inefficient fridges with efficient models, and upgrades on heating systems, hot water systems and stoves.











COMMUNITY INCLUSION PROGRAM

Operating out of Oaks Estate since 2018, the Community Inclusion program is designed for people living with psychosocial disabilities who are ineligible for National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) funding. The program assists individuals to make optimum choices, enhance their living skills and confidence, gain access to mainstream services, and shape and influence their community.

The program aims to increase the independence, social and community participation of people with a disability. It also aims to build capacity and readiness of organisations and the community to operate within a nationally consistent approach to Information Linkage and Capacity Building (ILC) outcomes.

The program offers individuals access to quality information about services that can best meet their needs. It also offers the development of social enterprise initiatives. Supported by a peer network, the service provides:

- information on relevant clinical services
- advice and assistance with daily living skills
- · referrals to workshops for stress and anger management
- · assistance in securing and sustaining tenancy and
- · information on social inclusion, education and volunteer and job opportunities.

The Society receives funding to operate this program through the Information Linkages and Capacity Building (ILC) program administered by the Australian Government Department of Social Services.

RETURN TO WORK PATHWAYS PROGRAM

Our new Women's Return to Work Pathways program is delivered in partnership with the St Vincent de Paul Society Canberra/Goulburn and is funded by the NSW Government through Women NSW. The program includes workshops and individual mentoring sessions to support women living on the NSW far South Coast, as well as the Goulburn and Young regions, to return to work.

The 2023 program is available to women living on the NSW far South Coast and includes a series of three workshops in each location. focused on:

- Identifying goals and time management skills
- Applying for jobs
- Drafting resumes and cover letters
- Preparing for job interviews
- Personal presentation for the workplace
- · Guest speakers: mindfulness and managing stress.





SOCIETY FUNDED PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

These programs are funded through donations and income generated through our retail shops.

NIGHT PATROL

Night Patrol engages with individuals on the streets at night, offering friendship, support and compassion while upholding their dignity. Night Patrol has been operating since 2001.

The Night Patrol team includes over 300 volunteers from within the community who receive training to help support those in need. They engage with the homeless, or those isolated by their health or other circumstances. Referrals are also available through Night Patrol.

Night Patrol visits take place in various locations across the ACT seven nights a week supported by specially equipped vans offering warm drinks, food, warm clothing, and other essential items.

HOME VISITATION

Home Visitation is carried out on a voluntary basis. Our volunteers are a diverse group who help people by giving them a hand up to make life-changing decisions. They respond to calls for assistance from people in need in their local community.

Volunteers visit people in their homes and help to find the most appropriate response to the person's or family's needs. This help is directly related to the specific needs of the individual and can include assistance with food, utility bills, clothing, education support, or connection to services.

The visits are informal and our volunteers are very sensitive to people's needs. Home visitation is a way by which people can be supported and encouraged to take control of their lives.

CLEMENTE ADULT EDUCATION

The Clemente program provides people who have experienced disadvantage and are wanting to re-engage in education with access to tertiary level education. The program is free, and students are provided with all textbooks and learning materials.

Operating in the ACT since 2009, Clemente is a partnership between the Society and the Australian Catholic University (ACU) offering three levels of study designed to suit a range of learning goals.

Classes are run by qualified educators. Volunteer in-class and off-campus mentors provide study assistance and help with organisational skills, work presentation, and basic computing.



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YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS PROGRAMS

The Youth and Young Adults programs are committed to equipping and empowering young people to become confident, active, and informed members of the community. Through our various service programs, school engagement initiatives, and advocacy opportunities, youth members and volunteers, together with the support of the Society, strive to generate an authentic and broad ranging impact in the community. Our volunteers use a strengths-based approach to nurture the social and emotional growth of the young people with whom they engage.

We offer five Youth and Young Adults Programs, each unique in their capacity to support young people in the ACT region.

ST JOE'S YOUTH PROGRAM

The St Joe's youth program was established in 1978. It offers respite and recreation for children aged between 6–12 years who are experiencing financial or social disadvantage. Holiday camps and weekend activities provide the children with new experiences and friendships and an opportunity to have fun during school holidays and weekends.

ST NICK'S YOUNG CARERS PROGRAM

The St Nick's program was established in 1998. It aims to provide recreational activities throughout the year for young people who have a caring role in their family. The program encourages the development of a strong and compassionate network, nurtures social and emotional development and holds space for young people as they navigate their life experiences.

SCHOOL ENGAGEMENT (PRIMARY & SECONDARY)

The Youth team has a strong presence in education settings from primary school to universities, expanding across Canberra. Our services range from advocacy to prevention-focussed mental health programs. The team offers a broad range of opportunities for young people to build a greater sense of identity, foster healthier relationships and take positive action in the community.

MIGRANT AND REFUGEE PROGRAM

The Migrant and Refugee Program has been supporting children from a migrant or refugee or asylum seeker background to feel connected, safe, valued, and empowered since 2019. Working in the school and





community settings, volunteers offer support in basic skill development as well as in emotional, social, and personal growth.

VINES

VINES stands for Vinnies, Inspiring, Networking, Education and Support and was established in 2017 in partnership with The Scout Association Australia (ACT). It supports young people between 13 –17 years. VINES encourages positive social inclusion and emotional development for young people and offers respite for young people and their families.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

Our Emergency Relief Helpline links people who are in crisis or experiencing hardship. Our employees and volunteers take calls from people seeking assistance from the Society, who help them to understand their needs and identify the type of assistance that may be appropriate, including:

- Food aid
- Transport and travel cost assistance
- Health and medical cost assistance
- · Utility bills cost assistance
- Advocacy support, for example with utility providers
- Access to essential clothing and bedding
- Educational support
- Connection to other services.

Assistance is available through the Helpline on 13 18 12 from 9.00am to 3.30pm Monday to Friday.

CLOTHING AND OTHER MATERIAL GOODS

The Society's retail shops have been selling quality donated clothing, furniture and other household items at affordable prices since 1963. There are now 27 retail shops across our region.

The retail shops provide a vital source of independent income and cash flow to fund the work that is undertaken by the Society and are an important point of referral for people needing assistance.

Through our retail shops, we distribute clothing and goods to people in need and provide a place where people can volunteer their time for the good of their communities and enjoy fellowship and companionship.

Volunteers undertake a wide range of tasks from sorting of donations through to retail tasks, including merchandising, to help retail shops operate successfully.

VINNIES WESTERN REGION CASE MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Vinnies Western Region Case Management Team provides case management support to assist our eight conferences across the Western Region (Boorowa, Cootamundra, Harden, Lake Cargelligo, Temora, Tumut, West Wyalong, Yass, and Young) and respond to their clients with complex needs.

Vinnies conferences offer a hand-up to those in crisis or experiencing hardship by providing financial and material aid, and food assistance.

CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME


